REGISTRATION:** Friday, September 14, 12:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- COST:** \$15 per Pathfinder, staff, cooks, children of staff/helpers and guests (ages 0-100 years old), \$50.00 security deposit per club and \$25.00 non-refundable registration fee per club.
- PARK
LOCATION:** HC59 - Hwy 154, Santa Barbara, CA 93105
(see Directions p. 5)
- CLUB
APPLICATION
DEADLINE:** Each Club’s application form must be in the Youth Ministries office on or before Tuesday, September 4, 2007 even if mailed.
- LATE
APPLICATION:** \$25 penalty per club for late applications after September 4, 2007.
- ACTIVITIES
BEGINS:** Friday, 6:00 p.m. – supper at your campsite
- REFUNDS:** There will be no refunds once a club has registered.
- RESPONSIBILITY:** Every club is responsible for knowing the contents of this packet and following the guidelines.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- ARRIVAL:** Clubs may set their campsites on Friday, September 14, starting at 12:00 p.m. Please **do not arrive before noon**, as the gate will not be open. Staff will be on the campground to direct clubs to camping area. **DO arrive before 7:30 p.m.** Activities start at 6:00 p.m. with supper at your campsite on Friday. Upon arrival clubs will be assigned their camp site. **After 10:00 p.m. the entrance road will be closed.** All cars henceforth shall park at the entrance parking lot. This includes all vehicles coming in on Sabbath.
- ADVENTURERS:** Adventurer clubs will not be permitted at the Camporee. If an Adventurer age child attends and is staying overnight, they will pay the \$15 per person fee.
- BIBLE BOWL:** Teen teams (ages 13-15) will participate on Friday evening and Junior teams (ages 10-12) on Sabbath afternoon. **You MUST PRE-REGISTER (p. 23) by September 4.** All teams must report to Headquarters at the designated time to organize and get ready for the event. There will be no late teams allowed. See p. 14 for bowl details.
- BIBLE BOWL TOPICS:** Teens topic: Gift of Prophecy
Junior topic: Diet and Healthful Living
Suggested books for study are:
- *The 27 Fundamental Beliefs* or the revised version called *Seventh-day Adventist Believe*
 - *Haskell's Handbook*
 - *Counsels on Diet and Foods* (EGW)
 - *Ministry of Healing* (EGW)
- BUSES & CARS:** There are no entrance fees for this campsite.
- BICYCLES:** No bicycle riding allowed during the weekend.
- CAMPFIRE COOKING:** Open campfires are not permitted. All cooking must be done on propane stoves. No liquid gas!
- CAMPING ASSIGNMENT:** At the entrance of the campground, clubs will check in for their assignment and then proceed to that site, which will be first come – first served. Do not come before 12:00 noon on Friday, as the gate will be locked.

CAMPSITES:

The campsites are among beautiful trees. One adult should be at the campsite at all times for security. The Youth Ministries Department is not responsible for lost or stolen items. **After 10:00 p.m. on Friday there will be no driving of vehicles on the campsite.** This rule is because of the dust that would be stirred up and safety. If a club comes in after 10:00 p.m. you will park at the entrance lot and carry all your equipment by hand to the site. Do all you can to have someone come and set up your site during daylight.

CARS:

Cars may be parked at your campsite. **However, if cars must be moved during any portion of the weekend, they must be parked down at the entrance parking lot.** Be considerate of those around you of stirring up dust and safety of campers. We are asking your help in monitoring this important issue by asking you to report violations of this rule. Any club who moves their vehicle after 10:00 p.m. Friday will lose their security deposit. Visitors must park at the parking lot at the entrance of the campground.

CHAPERONES:

An adult over the age of 18 must be with Pathfinders at all meetings, programs, events, and free time. There must be at least one adult at each campsite at all times for security. Teens are not to be on their own. They will need to be chaperoned as well.

CHAIRS:

All chairs brought to meetings must be situated in the back, not blocking the view of those sitting on the ground.

CHECKOUT:

A designated person will inspect your club's area at the end of the Camporee. Come to the trash bin behind Headquarters to contact an individual to check your club out. If everything is in order and cleaned up, the individual will fill out and give the club a Checkout Sheet. The club needs to **mail it to the Youth Ministries Department for the Security Deposit to become a refundable-credited amount.** It is not the checkout person's responsibility to mail it. For more information refer to item "Refund of Security Deposit Certificate" on p. 8 and "Security Deposit" on p. 9. Clubs may stay as long as they desire on Sunday. A check of the general areas will be made to ensure your

area is clean. If the park charges the Conference for clean up, the amount will be forwarded to the individual clubs.

CHURCH: Church will be at 11:00 a.m. at the location indicated on the map.

CLUB TIME: There will be periods of time through the weekend when clubs will have some free time. Please plan accordingly. The golf course and river is off limits to our camping group.

CLUB WORSHIP: At the designated times for club worship, all clubs with their Pathfinders, staff, children, and guests should be in worship.

DEPOSIT: A \$50 refundable security deposit is to be paid per club. Infraction of rules will forfeit this deposit. At the end of the Camporee you will receive a Checkout Sheet if your area is clean. Mail the Checkout Sheet to our office **within 2 weeks**. See p. 8, "Refund of Security Deposit Certificate" and p. 4 "Checkout."

DIRECTIONS: Directions to Lake Cachuma From Glendale
Driving Time: 2 hours with moderate traffic
Driving Distance: 120 miles

From Glendale take the 134 West to the 101 North.
Go toward Santa Barbara.

Stay on the freeway thru Santa Barbara.

Exit State Street/154 (approximately 106 miles from Glendale).

First traffic light, go straight following the Lake Cachuma sign.

Second traffic light, turn right and follow the Lake Cachuma sign.

Go approximately 13 miles.

There will be a golf course on the right side of the road.
SLOW DOWN!

Half way through the golf course there will be a sign on the right side of the road that says "Live Oak Park".

Take the first small road on the right off of Highway 154 and follow signs to the campground.

If you see a sign saying Lake Cachuma, you went too far.

DISCIPLINE:	The Conference Youth Director has the authority to ask any club or individual to leave the campground if disciplinary action is needed.
ELECTRICITY:	There is no electricity for clubs to use. Plan accordingly.
ENTRANCE FEES:	There are no entrance fees for this campground. It is included in your fees.
FIRE PROTECTION:	All clubs should have filled water buckets at their campsite and fire extinguishers at their cooking area in case of fire. Be extremely careful because of the dry surrounding areas and low-water season.
FIRST-AID:	Each club must provide itself with an ample, well-supplied first-aid kit. Check with your local Red Cross for a suggested list of supplies.
FLAGS:	Bring and display your flags in the proper manner. Each unit should also display its Guidon flags.
FOOD:	Please be extra careful in storing your perishables. Menu must be all vegetarian!!!!!! You will lose your deposit if flesh food is served and/or brought to the campgrounds.
FOOD SAFETY:	When using dairy products be careful of contamination. Keep these items at 40 degrees or below. Leftovers and cooked food should be handled appropriately.
GENERATORS:	Generators are allowed. Please be considerate when you use them. We are camping in close quarters and the noise should not bother your neighbor. All generators are to be turned off by 11 p.m.
GOLF COURSE/ RIVER:	At no time is our group allowed on the nearby golf course. Please do not walk to the course or fairways. Please do not go to the river. We are confined to the camping area only.
HOSPITALS:	If a hospital is needed directions are in this packet on pages 20-21.
INSURANCE:	Every official club registered for the weekend is covered by your own church insurance. Have in your

possession an accident claim form from your church.

**MEDICAL
EMERGENCY:**

Anyone needing emergency medical treatment should first check with Headquarters and the Conference Youth Director to get the proper insurance form before going to the hospital. By using this form, no payment is necessary when receiving treatment.

**MEDICAL REALSE
FORM:**

An Emergency Medical Treatment Authorization Form (p. 19) must be filled out for each Pathfinder and staff less than 18 years of age whose parent is not coming to the Camporee. This form must be in the possession of the club director or the person the director designates at Camporee.

MEETINGS:

Pathfinders, staff, and guests/visitors are expected to attend all meetings. Counselors must sit with their units during all meetings. The club must sit together always with adult staff present. One adult should be at the campsite at all times for security. The Youth Ministries Department is not responsible for lost or stolen items.

**MOTORIZED
VEHICLES:**

No motorized bikes, cycles, scooters, etc. allowed. No cars will be allowed to be driven on the campsite after 10:00 p.m. Friday night.

MOVIE NIGHT

There will be three large screen old-time movies shown on Saturday night. Clubs for a fundraiser may sell refreshments. Please no caffeine drinks and no meat. If you wish to do the fundraiser, pre-register on the Club Application. There is a \$10 non-refundable fee.

NIGHT LIGHTING:

Be prepared with flashlights as the campground has no night lighting and it is very dark. Keep your Pathfinders, guests and staff safe.

**PARK
REGISTRATION:**

Only the club director or his designee will register their club at the entrance for the final registration phase.

PEANUT DROP

On Sunday, 10:00 a.m. at Headquarters we will have a Peanut Drop. An airplane will fly over camp and drop 100 pounds of fresh, delicious peanuts.

**POINTS FOR
CAMPOREE:**

To receive points, each club must have:

1. Campsite established before **7:00 p.m.** on

Friday

2. At least $\frac{3}{4}$ (75%) of staff and Pathfinders attending and camping on site
3. Do not leave before the close of the last program on Sunday.

PREPARE FOR BED:

A time is designated on the schedule as “prepare for bed.” This is NOT a recreational time. This is the time when campers should brush their teeth, use the restrooms, change their clothes, etc. This could also be used for club worship to end the day.

REFRESHMENT SALES

Refreshments may be sold by clubs at Headquarter tables. There is a \$10.00 non-refundable fee for clubs selling items. Clubs must pre-register on the Club Application. Clubs will be assigned a place to sell their goodies. The area must be cleaned up after the sale.

REFUND OF SECURITY DEPOSIT CERTIFICATES:

This certificate can be used to purchase supplies in our office. It is valid for one year only. The Checkout Sheet is to be mailed to the Youth Ministries Department within **two weeks (on or before October 1, 2007)** for the Refund Certificate. **No exceptions!** The Youth Ministries Department will mail the Refund Certificate to you, once we have received the Checkout Sheet.

REFUNDS:

No refunds after a club registers!

REGISTRATION FEE:

There is a non-refundable registration fee of \$25 per club to help cover the expenses of the Camporee.

RV's:

There are no hook-ups for RV's. RV's may be parked at your designated campsite.

SABBATH HOURS:

Let us, as leaders, set the example in Sabbath keeping. Guard against ball tossing, Frisbee playing, bike riding, and boisterous non-Sabbath activities. Storytelling and AY course work is always good when there are slack moments with any of your units. Be careful not to lead the Pathfinders to break the Sabbath. Instead, guide them into creative things to do so the Sabbath will become a blessing.

SABBATH MEAL TIME:

Time is given after meals to clean up and prepare for the upcoming meeting. Some will not need as much

time because of the size of their club. Please do not leave your Pathfinders without supervision. This time could be spent in creative Sabbath activities.

SECURITY DEPOSIT:

A \$50 refundable Security Deposit will be required for each club in attendance. This deposit will be a refundable credited amount if the rules in this packet are followed. If any rules are violated as stated in this packet, you will forfeit your deposit. The credit may be used towards the purchase of supplies located in the Youth Ministries Department. See “Refunds” and “Refund of Security Deposit Certificates” on p. 8.

SELF-SUFFICIENT:

All clubs must be self-sufficient in providing all of their equipment and needs for the weekend.

SEMINAR/HONORS:

Each club will offer either a Sabbath appropriate honor or a seminar relating with the different class (Friend, Companion, up through Master Guide) requirements. Indicate your choice on the application. Your choice will need to fit within the time frame of 2 ½ hours on Sabbath 9:30 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. (Examples from Activity Diaries: p.5 of Companion; p. 7 of Ranger). Keep in mind that your choice must be long enough to fill the 2 ½ hours.

SETTING UP CAMP:

Camp set-up will be from 12:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Friday. The Youth Ministries Department will not be responsible for any lost, broken or stolen items.

SHORTS:

Walking shorts will be permitted. No jogging shorts or short shorts.

SHOWERS:

The shower building will be closed and unavailable for use.

SUNDAY:

Solvang, a Danish style village, is 12 miles from our camping area. This would be an excellent field trip to take the Pathfinders to. It has many small shops, eateries, and points of interest.

Also a miniature golf course is available in Ventura. In Santa Barbara, Ventura, and Oxnard beaches are plentiful if you would like to take your club there.

SUPERVISION:

All Pathfinders need to be supervised at all times by a

staff over the age of 18. If minor Pathfinders are unsupervised, you risk the chance of losing your deposit.

- TABLES:** Each club must bring their own tables and chairs.
- TARPS:** Large tarps or builder's plastic should be provided by each club to give shade/rain shelter for its cooking. Bring extra tarps to sit on during meetings.
- TENTS:** All tents should be positioned in an orderly fashion. If there are RV's or chuck wagons in use, they may be positioned at your campsite. Please have campsites set up before Sabbath.
- TLT's:** Once again we are including our active Conference registered TLT's in the programming and running of the Camporee. Each TLT club that wishes to participate must have each TLT registered with the Conference and fill out the application on p. 23.
- TOILETS:** There will be sufficient out-house toilets available to accommodate everyone. Toilet paper will be provided, but each club should bring extra rolls.
- TRANSPORTATION:** Vehicles used to transport Pathfinders must have one seat belt for each Pathfinder. All drivers must be 21 years old or older with a valid California driver's license. All cars must have the proper insurance coverage. Absolutely no transporting of passengers in the back of pick-ups! This is extremely dangerous!
- TRASH:** All trash must be in plastic trash bags, tied securely, and placed in the trash bin located in the back of Headquarters. Persons bringing the trash must be tall enough to get the bag into the dumpster. The bag may not be left beside the dumpster. **If the bag breaks it will be your responsibility to re-bag and dispose the trash. No open bags or litter should be seen on the ground. Use thick trash bags to transport your trash to the bins.**
- UNIFORM:** Uniform A will be worn for Sabbath morning and church. Pathfinders and staff may change into uniform B for the afternoon.

**VEHICLE
INSURANCE:**

All drivers must be licensed, 21 years old or older, with a California driver's license. Vehicles used must be properly insured with medical and liability insurance. It is the responsibility of the club director to follow through on this policy.

VISITORS:

Visitors may visit clubs during Sabbath. They should park in the designated area located at the entrance of the campground and walk to their destination. Please let the elderly and handicap know this rule. Anyone wanting to stay overnight and not be considered a day visitor will pay the \$15 camp fee (even if staying for one night) and be included on the registration form.

WASTE WATER:

Please do not let the water run off from water spigots to another club's camping area. Take extra care on this issue. Clubs will lose their deposit if this takes place.

WATER:

1. Water is available at faucets around the campground.
2. No personal hygiene or dishwashing at the water faucets.
3. Bring extra containers for water. Water faucets may not be near your immediate area.
4. No running of hoses to campsites, camp trailers, or RV's.
5. No water hook-ups leading to any campsite.

- Multiple choice answers
 - Questions will be written on a piece of paper and each team will receive the questions and work from this source.
 - Each question will have four possible answers – A, B, C, D. Four separate cards marked A, B, C, D will be supplied to each team.
 - When the answer is called for, the club representatives shall bring only one card with their choice of answers.
 - The Questions will be read aloud just before the answer is called for.
 - Once the Bible Bowl starts, no late participants will be able to participate.
 - The judges will be selected individuals.
 - There will be 20 questions, each worth 5 points apiece. A total of 100 points will be possible.
 - Ribbons will be given to the five team members for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place.
- CHAIRS:** Each team needs to bring one folding chair to sit on in the designated area.
- REPORT ATTENDANCE:** All teams must report to Headquarters at the designated time to organize and get ready for the event. There will be no late teams allowed to participate even if you have pre-registered. You must report attendance **on time**.

- D. Flags and Guidons displayed in front of your campsite
- E. Name of Club identified

2. TENTS

- A. Align tents in a systematic sequence
- B. Tents pitched properly (ropes and poles tight and secure)
- C. Doors and windows closed
- D. Water buckets in tent area marked "FOR FIRE ONLY"
- E. Designated worship area

3. COOKING AREA

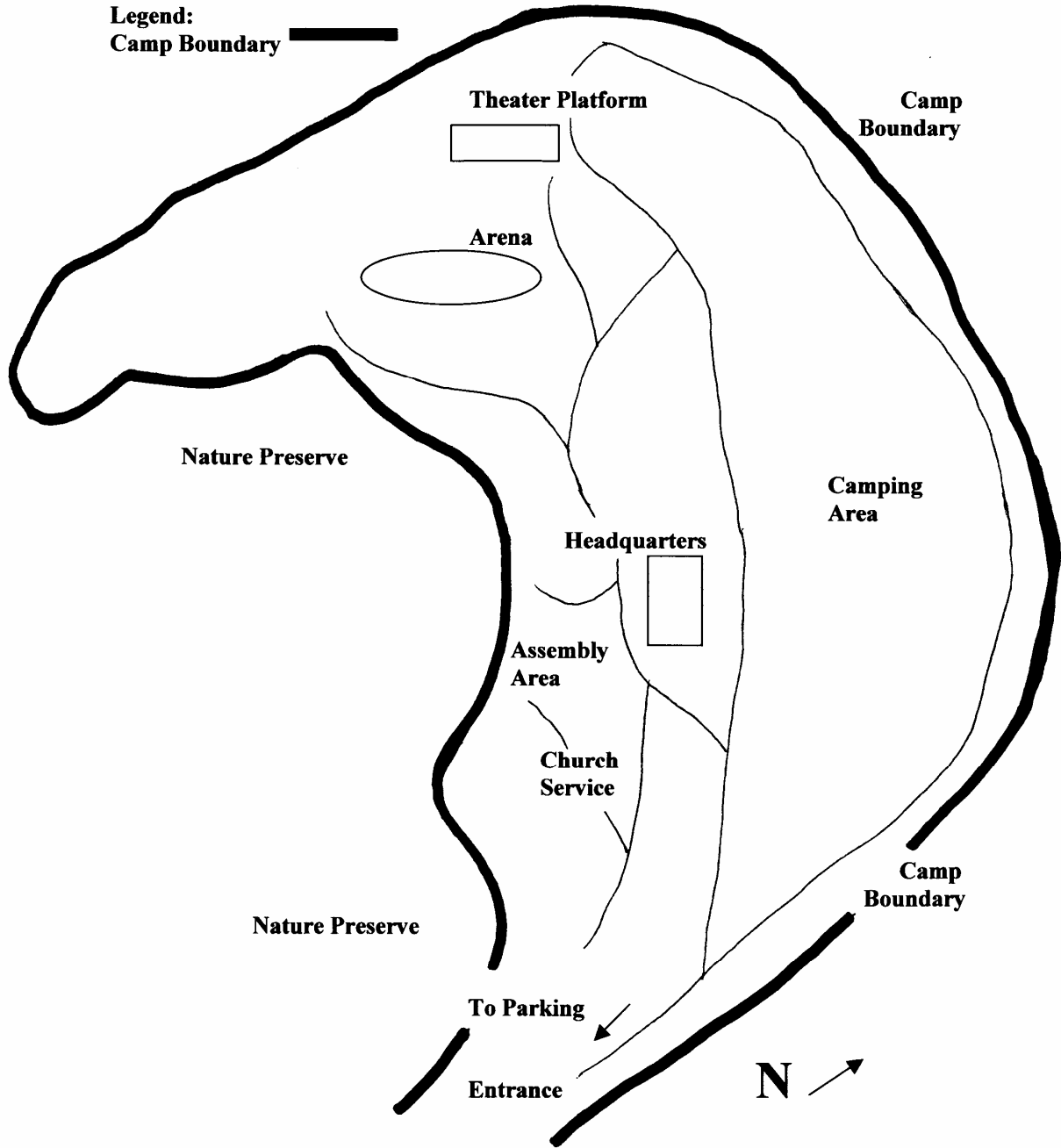
- A. Menu (**vegetarian required**) and kitchen duties available where all can read
- B. Food stored to be animal and insect safe
- C. Utensils stored neatly
- D. Fire extinguisher readily available
- E. Proper storage for cold items, e.g.: milk, eggs, mayonnaise, etc.

4. HEALTH FACILITIES

- A. First-aid kit available
- B. Emergency Medical Treatment Authorization Forms available for each child and staff less than 18 years of age
- C. Trash receptacles provided (club furnishes trash bags with ties)
- D. Three-tub dish washing set-up (separate from cooking area)
- E. Tent capacity no more than what it was designed for
